



FAMILIES SERVE, TOO

For nearly 50 years, the National Military Family Association has been the voice of military families. Standing behind America's heroes is a form of sacrifice that many don't understand. Multiple deployments and constant relocations create stress on families. Wounds, illnesses, and injuries also have a significant impact on the family as well as the service member. When a family is well supported, a service member is better able to focus on the task ahead—whether it is mission or recovery.

OUR PROGRAMS

NMFA provides spouse scholarships, camps for military kids, retreats for families reconnecting after deployment and for the families of the wounded, ill or injured. NMFA serves the families of the currently serving, retired, wounded or fallen members of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard and Commissioned Corps of the USPHS and NOAA.

OPERATION PURPLE

Created in 2004, our Operation Purple® Camps have provided 58,000 kids a free week at camp where they can connect with other military kids and can get away from the stresses of military life while surrounded with the emotional support they need—including professional counselors that are culturally competent in military life.

Along the way, we created Operation Purple Family Retreats and Healing Adventures to serve families dealing with deployment, reintegration, and injury or illness.
